"Mohammad and Zoroaster to the middle East." added Shahla not wanting to be left behind.


"But what is 'man-fist-ton'?" asked little Anisa.


banashi' teller." laughed Mother.

3-D Paper 9 pointed Stars

Materials:

Star template Crayons, sparkle glue Scissors Tape Scissors

Method

*Print copies of the Star template (5 or 9 little squares) *Color, or sparkle the front and back of the Star template papers (or leave white).

*Cut out 9 squares, (or 5 for a 5-pointed star).

*Fold each square together diagonally where the lines come together.

* Cut each of the four lines until it comes to the open space.

* Unfold and tape the insides of the inner square (A).

* Turn it over, and tape the second (B) square's tips together.

* Turn it over, and tape the third(C) square's tips together over the (A) tips

* Turn it over, and tape the fourth (D) square's tips over the (B) tips.

* Turn it over, and tape the last square's (E) tips together over the (C) tips

* The first point of the star is finished. Do this with each square.

*Tape the ends and middles of each point together with the other ones, to make a star.

*Put double sided tape on the back of the Star and tape it to a window!








